#### **CAMPING CHILAQUILES**

This camping breakfast chilaquiles recipe is so simple and comes together in a snap.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 16 oz can of enchilada sauce
- 1 tsp Olive oil
- 20 corn tortillas cut into eighths
- 1 cup roasted corn or whatever filling you have on hand
- ½ cup crumbled cotija cheese
- 5-6 eggs
- ½ cup cilantro
- Juice of 1 lime
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper

#### **TOPPINGS:**

- Chopped fresh cilantro leaves for garnish
- Lime slices for garnish
- Quick pickled red onions slice onions and let rest in rice wine vinegar for 15 mins
- Hot sauce
- Mexican crema sauce



#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Greased Dutch Oven.
- 2. Open enchilada sauce.
- 3. Cover bottom of Dutch Oven with olive oil. Layer corn tortillas in with the sauce, cheese and any toppings desired. (It is best to cover all tortillas so they don't dry out). Top with cracked eggs if desired.
- 4. Place in a campfire for 30 minutes. Until top is browned and cooked through and egg whites are set with runny yolks.
- 5. Top with cilantro, lime slices, and pickled red onions. Serve with hot sauce and crema if desired. Enjoy!

## CREEK FIRE ANIMAL RESCUE

Many thanks go out to Fresno County Sheriff's Posse, High Sierra Mounted Search and Rescue (SAR) for their quick response during the Creek Fire evacuation. Horses, donkeys, pigs, sheep, goats, lamas, alpacas, rabbits, and chickens were loaded in trailers and transported to different locations. Sallie K. Phillips, DVM, Owner of Sierra Veterinary Hospital located in Auberry also assisted in the animal rescue, and opened her ranch to those in need. Naomi Flam, founder of the Central California Animal Disaster Team (CCADT) set up temporary pet housing locations so that folks could bring their animals to a safe place. Food, water, and love, were all given to them while some owners turned to the Red Cross for help. Motel rooms were then offered to those who had nowhere to go. Leslie Harris, Shelter Manager of the Clovis Rodeo Grounds, worked hard at mapping stalls, and making sure that livestock could be identified. They quickly reached capacity and re-directed evacuees to the Fresno County Fair Grounds and to local families that volunteered their properties. It was the middle of the night when deputy manager of the Big Fresno Fair, Lauri King, knew it was time to evacuate, taking her family, livestock and belongings to the Fresno Fairgrounds. Longhorn Feed and Supply gathered hay, and much needed water buckets and troughs, having collected cash donations from generous and caring locals. Manager Kristi Dorrell told ABC News reporter "This is our backyard right now, these are our customers that come down to support us. It's our time to support them." Special thanks to Supervisor Nathan Magsig, and Officer Justice Jones for all their help at Shaver Lake and the surrounding communities. SAR volunteers went extra miles, literally, to feed and water animals that stayed in place throughout the evacuation time frame. Many families facing all the challenges that come with fire threat and evacuation were a bit relieved knowing that their animals and pets, both large and small, wild and tame, were being cared for.

# DESERT RIDE AT STARLIGHT RANCH NE OF ROSAMOND CA

February 18-21, 2021

We normally go into town (Rosamond 1/2 hr away) Friday night for dinner at our favorite Mexican restaurant. There is an Albertsons, convenience stores and gas stations there. A Simple Breakfast to be provided at 9:00am Saturday and Sunday. Potluck Dinner Saturday, we will provided. We need RSVP by February 12th. Need to bring water and anything else they want to drink. Some beds (5) available but need to secure with us. Bed rolls tents and whatever is needed for general camping. Terrain is simple to difficult depending on trail with all trails being packed to loose desert soils that are easy on the hoofs. Coyotes and Jack rabbits mice and desert rats for local animals. There are snakes but I have never seen one and we have done a lot of cross country out there. Most of the trails/roads are a gradual climb but depends on what you want to do. There is one that goes up to the PCT but would be a long ride. Clean up needs to be done behind horses and distribute outside fence. Take out all other that you bring in. There is a new outhouse on the property and a flush toilet in the house. May want to bring your own toiletries to be safe.

The gate at the ranch will be open at noon on the 18th and property will be cleared and gate closed by 2pm Sunday the 21st.

**Directions:** Starlight Ranch is already tagged on google maps if you use that. The map shows traveling on what is called Aqueduct RD but you want to go 30' further on Backus Rd to what we call Upper Aqueduct RD where you will see a large Rock painted with a Smiley Face. Although the lower road can be used to get there, there are more obstacles and a large dip that larger trailers may have issues with. Take CA Hwy 99 south to CA Hwy 58 East out of Bakersfield to Tehachapi about 43 miles. Exit at Tehachapi Blvd and go Right on Tehachapi Blvd. Loves Truck Stop will be on your Right. Continue on Tehachapi Blvd for 1 mile and go Right on Willow Springs Road and follow for 16.0 miles where you will turn Right on Backus RD. Backus RD is paved for about 1.2 miles When you come to the end of the pavement you will see a dirt road to the right that you will proceed on. The rest of the trip is on dirt roads. You will continue on Dirt Backus RD over a short bridge and on to Upper Aqueduct RD. You will see a large rock painted with a Smiley Face. Turn left and continue on Upper Aqueduct RD for 3.6 miles to 140th St. There will be a curved dirt road leading to the right onto 140th St and most will want to take that. You will see a sign on your left that says Starlight Ranch. Go left before the sign and drive straight back about 100 feet and through the


gate to the ranch. You will need to bring water for overnight stays. The ranch is cyclone fenced but horses/stock will need to be tied up. There are just 3-4 highline areas first come first serve. There are some bed opportunities in the house and out buildings on the property but please call to claim. Jim and Doug Laber will be hosting the ride at the Starlight Ranch which is owned by Family. We will have a generator there that gives us lights in the house in the evenings. There is a large patio and fire pit for gatherings. Firewood if you have it will help and we will be bringing some out with us. It can get very cold and or very windy at the ranch so be prepared for that. Jim Laber, Cell: 559-250-7906,






