DUTCH OVEN CHICKEN MARBELLA

Sweet, savory, crispy and saucy, this Dutch oven recipe for Chicken Marbella delivers a "gourmet" campfire experience but without any of the work.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup chopped prunes
- 1 cup olives, pitted & halved
- ½ cup dry white wine
- ¼ cup capers
- ¼ cup red wine vinegar
- 6 cloves garlic, roughly chopped

- 2 tablespoons dried oregano
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 chicken thighs, skin on
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 teaspoons brown sugar



INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. MARINATE THE CHICKEN: Place all ingredients except for the oil and brown sugar in a freezer bag to marinate. Place in your ice chest for at least 6 hours and up to 48 hours.
- 2. PREP YOUR CAMPFIRE: Prepare 27 coals. You can use wood embers if you must, but you'll have to guestimate the proper heat ratio (you're aiming for 425F). Once all the coals are ready, knock them into a flat pile and place dutch oven on top of all of them. This will produce the high heat required for browning.
- 3. BROWN THE CHICKEN: Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in the Dutch oven. The oil is hot and ready when a drop of water instantly sizzles when it hits the pan. Remove the chicken from the marinade, and dust 1 teaspoon brown sugar over the skin side of each thigh. Brown the thighs skin side down over high heat until the skin is crispy and deep golden brown, about 6-8 minutes. Flip to brown the other side, 2 minutes.
- 4. BAKE: Remove Dutch oven from heat. Add the marinade (liquid, prunes, olive, capers and all!) to the dutch oven and cover. Evenly distribute 18 coals on the lid and set the Dutch oven on a bed of 9 coals. Bake for 30 minutes, until the thighs are cooked through and their juices run clear when pierced with a knife.
- 5. SERVE & ENJOY: Serve over couscous, rice, or pilaf with some of the sauce spooned over the top.

- ~\$10.00 per person



SPANISH LAKE A TRIP FROM THE PAST

One of our favorite pack trips is to go into Spanish Lake. The trailheads are close to Wishon Village. This is a lake that you can reach by two different trail heads. Spanish lake can be reached from the Rancheria Trailhead then turning off just past Cow Meadow. The other way is to leave from the Crown Valley Trailhead through Statum Meadow. As many times as we have been there we have never gone the same way twice as there are many cow trails in the area. However when we get into the area we just look for the familier bowl and head for it. Usually the lake can be reached in a couple of hours.

The fishing has always been fantastic if you know which rock to fish from. It is usually quiet with little traffic. Settting up a base camp you can also ride out to Geraldine Lake which is a beautiful setting near the ridge. Temperatures are always nice and cool in the summertime. Nights can be especially cool so take proper gear.





Objectives & Purpose of the Backcountry Horseman of California From the BCHC Bylaws

- To improve and promote the use, care and development of California backcountry trails, campsites, streams and meadows; to advocate good trail manners.
- To promote the conservation and utilization of our backcountry resources in concert with livestock transportation.
- To keep the backcountry trails and forage areas open to horseman on all public lands.
- To keep current information before the Corporation membership and its local Units regarding new legis-lation or management plans related to government regulations of the backcountry.
- To support or oppose new proposals, plans and restrictions as related to the interest of horsemen and those persons interested in recreational stock use and enjoying the backcountry.
- To promote the interest of people who, due to health or physical factors, need transportation other than by foot on backcountry trails.
- To promote public awareness and interest in the historical aspect of horsemen and stock in the back-country and to help educate backcountry users on the ways to use the trail and foraged in a manner that conserves the backcountry resources.
- To assist in keeping the public informed of the vital need for a clean backcountry.
- To promote a working relationship with and keep the work and interests of the Corporation before our local, state and federal officials.
- To assist in the formation and continuation of local Units to carry out these purposes.
